## PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-62895 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to USDA Forest Service, Malheur National Forest of 139 NE Dayton Stree, John Day, Oregon 97845, phone 575-1731, for the construction of SW-1 Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, tributary to Fox Creek for livestock and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined\* The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 19, Township 10 South, Range 30 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

The maximum height will be 9.9 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10.0 feet , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 3:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.1 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 2.5 feet

\* by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimension of the spillway are: Around dam with a bottom width 7.0 feet, top width 9.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 3.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.2 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 24, 1981 for 0.03 af; June 15, 1983 for 0.17 af

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 14, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
