PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68008 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Helmut Fink of 17617 Abiqua Road, NE, Silverton, Oregon 97381, phone 873-8164, for the construction of two reservoirs, tributaries of Abiqua Creek, and storage of water from Alder Creek to be maintained by appropriation under Application 68009, Permit 48442 for fish culture,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: Reservoir 1 - SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 28; Reservoir 2 - SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 27 both within Township 6 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Marion.

The maximum height will be 9.9 each feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0, slope of upstream face 4:1, slope of downstream face 4:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.0 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet

The location and dimension of the spillway is: None.

The locations and dimensions of the outlet conduits will be: 8 foot flashboard.

The structures is in the channel.

The dams will be earthfill construction

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 10.0 acre-feet, being 5.0 af in each reservoir

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is January 30, 1984.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 30, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.
