PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68065 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Cedar Lake Tree Farm of 5422 Liberty Road, S., Salem, Oregon 97306, phone 399-1440, for the construction of Cedar Lake Reservoir, a tributary of Battle Creek, and storage of water from Wain Creek for recreation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, Township 8 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Marion.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a, slope of upstream face n/a, slope of downstream face n/a, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.94 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 9.0 feet

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: Around the dam, bottom width 8.0 feet, top width 25.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway each 2.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: Overflow conduit - 12 inch diameter (off channel excavated reservoir.

The structure out of the channel.

The dam will be earth excavation construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 5.6 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is April 20, 1984 .

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 15, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 .
