PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-60681 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Ochoco National Forest of Box 14, Paulina Ranger Station, Paulina, Oregon 97751, phone 477-3373, for the construction of Coyote Reservoir and storage of water from Fort Creek, a tributary to South Fork John Day River for livestock and wildlife, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored *
The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 11, Township 16 South, Range 26 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

The maximum height will be 4.2 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 4.0 feet, slope of upstream face 2:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.2 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.039 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 2.5 feet

* water when determined by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: Around the dam, bottom width 5.0 feet, top width 10.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway each 2.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.07 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is March 4, 1983 .

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 28, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 .
