PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-64785 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to USDI, Bureau of Land Management of Box 151, Lakeview, Oregon 97630, phone 947-2177, for the construction of Malheur Creek Waterhole Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, a tributary of Lost River for wildlife and livestock, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when * The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 22, Township 39 South, Range 13 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a , slope of upstream face n/a . slope of downstream facen/a , and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.5 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 5.0 feet

determined by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The proposed reservoir is pit type. Dam will consist of excavated dirt placed on downslope side of reservoir.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.5 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is January 26, 1983 .

August 14, 1985 Actual construction work shall begin on or before and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 $85\,$.
