

* APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Fred F. Jones (Name of applicant) of Wallowa (Postoffice), County of Wallowa, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Wallowa River (Name of stream), a tributary of Grande Ronde

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 2.0 cubic feet per second. (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is fish ponds and hatchery (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 750 ft. S (N. or S.) and 780 ft. E (E. or W.) from the NW corner of Sec. 19, T. 1, R. 43 E (Section or subdivision)

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 2.0 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Wallowa River

The use to which this water is to be applied is fish ponds and hatchery

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is March 25, 1931

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 29, 1932 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before Oct. 1, 1933

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before Oct. 1, 1934
