

***APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT**

I, Wayne E. Phillips (Name of applicant)

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.75 cubic feet per second, measured at the point of diversion from the stream, throughout the irrigation season from April 1, to October 1, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer. water users, from Powder River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, shall not exceed 3 acre feet per acre throughout the irrigation season from April 1, to October 1, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.

The priority date of this permit is July 7, 1933

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 20, 1934 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before Oct. 1, 1935

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before Oct. 1, 1936
