STATE OF OREGON, } ss. County of Marion,

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use measured at the point of diversion from the stream, and shall not exceed 1.5 cubic feet per second/or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from seepage water

The use to which this water is to be applied is supplemental irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, shall not exceed 3/4 of one acre foot per acre during any 30-day period prior to June 1, 1/2 acre foot per acre during any 30-day period after June 1, of each year, shall not exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre during any irrigation season, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is March 20, 1934

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 26, 1935 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before Oct. 1, 1936

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before Oct. 1, 1937
