

*APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT ~~ENTRANCE~~ 12154

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Homer Moore (Name of applicant) of Route 1, Ashland (Postoffice), County of Jackson, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is two springs and seepage originating from cut (Name of stream) made by Oregon State Highway #99, a tributary of Bear Creek

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.06 cubic feet per second. (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

**3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 1000 N 850 E 850 ft. N and 950 ft. E from the S 1/4 corner of Section 14 (Section or subdivision) (If preferable, give distance and bearing to section corner)

5. The ditch (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) to be 1200 feet (Miles or feet) in length, terminating in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Sec. 14, Tp. 39 S (Smallest legal subdivision) (N. or S.) R. 1 E, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to existing rights and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Two springs and seepage

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is September 14, 1936

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 15, 1937 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before Oct. 1, 1938

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before Oct. 1, 1939
