* APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Brown Bros. by H. E. Brown, Partner (Name of applicant) of 710 Mead St., Grants Pass (Post office), County of Josephine, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Munger Creek (Name of stream), a tributary of Williams Creek

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 1.0 cubic feet per second. (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

**3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Milling (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 150 ft. N and 10 ft. E from the corner of center of section 6 (Section or subdivision) (If preferable, give distance and bearing to section corner)

PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Munger Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is Log pond use and general sawmill purposes

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is February 18, 1943

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 15, 1944 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1945

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1946
