following described public waters of the State of Oregon, **SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:**

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

Diversion Works—

6. (a) Height of dam 5 feet, length on top 10 feet, length at bottom

Description of original Wilson tracts.

West portion:- Beginning at an iron pipe two inches in diameter and four feet long driven into the ground on the line between Lots 7 and 8 Section 34, Township 25 south, Range 13 West of Willamette Meridian, said post being 615.0 feet South from the Northeast corner of the said Lot 8, thence running South along the said lot line 500.2 feet to a cedar post 4" x 4" x 30" driven into the ground, said post being on the North line of Donation Land Claim No. 41, thence West along said Claim line 435.4 feet to a cedar post 4" x 4" x 30" driven into the ground, from which a hemlock tree 24 inches in diameter bears N. 05° 45' E. 18.8 feet, and a spruce tree 36 inches in diameter bears N. 32° 45' E. 68.3 feet, thence Northerly parallel with the east line of the said Lot 8, 501.8 feet to a cedar post 4" x 4" x 30" driven into the ground; thence Easterly 435.4 feet to the place of beginning, containing 5 acres, more or less, and being a portion of Lot 8, Section 34, Township 25 South, Range 13 West of Willamette Meridian.

Excepting all rights of way for roads and other rights of way heretofore granted.

East Portion:- Beginning at an iron pipe two inches in diameter and four feet long driven into the ground on the line between Lots 4 and 8 Section 34, Township 25 South, Range 13 West of Willamette Meridian, said post being 615.0 feet South from the Northwest corner of the said Lot 7, thence running South along the said lot line 500.2 feet to a cedar post 4" x 4" x 30" driven into the ground, said post being on the North line of Donation Claim No. 41, thence East along said Donation Claim Line a distance of 261.4 feet; thence North parallel with the west line of said Lot 7 a distance of 499.2 feet; thence Westerly 261.4 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 3.00 acres, more or less, and being a portion of Lot 7 of Section 34, Township 25 South, Range 13 West of Willamette Meridian.

Note:- Since these tracts were acquired, the following smaller tracts have been deeded off by Mr. Wilson as follows:- to Roy Jacobson, 1.35 acres, as shown on the map. To Vance Eager, 2.33 acres, as shown on the map. To Smallhorst, 0.5 acres, a strip 43.5 feet wide along the east side of the east tract, prior to the issuing of the Eager deed. There is no deed of record, or written covering the present actual ownership of Mr. Wilson.

Description of Vance Eager Tract:

Beginning at a point in Lot 7 of Section 34, Township 25 South, Range 13 West of W. M, from which point the Northwest corner of the said Lot 7 of Section 34 bears N. 11° 31' W. a distance of 627.63 feet:- and running thence S. 41° 03' W. for a distance of 167.1 feet to the Southeast corner of the tract deeded to Jacobson; thence N. 86° 43' W. along the Jacobson tract south boundary for a distance of 453.0 feet; thence South for a distance of 160.6 feet; thence East for a distance of 652.2 feet; thence North for a distance of 260.6 feet; thence West for a distance of 91.5 feet to the point of beginning, Containing 2.51 acres, more or less, of which area 0.18 acres lies within the boundaries of the County Road, leaving a net area of 2.33 acres, more or less, and being a portion of lots 7 and 8 of Section 34, Township 25 South, Range 13 West of Willamette Meridian.

Remarks: Since the creek at the point of diversion runs in a dug channel about three feet deep, it is planned to back the water up high enough to flow by gravity out over the bottom land as shown for the Eager area west of the road. The completion of domestic use for the Eager residence must wait for availability of building materials, since their house is not yet built but will be as soon as possible. It is desired to make this a joint filing so that both families have the same priority for the use of the water which appears to be ample for both.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.057 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Unnamed Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is Domestic and irrigation, being 0.02 c.f.s. for domestic and 0.037 for irrigation.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is August 8, 1944

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 15, 1945 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1946

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1947
