

* APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, John and Henry Johnson (Name of applicant) of Beaverton Rt. 2 (Post office), County of ... State of ... do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Spring Creek and Johnson Spring (Name of stream) trib. of Cedar Mill Creek, a tributary of Tualatin River

Tract One: Beginning at the Southeast corner of the Josiah Hall D.L. C. No. 58 Township 1 South Range 1 West, a point in Section 3 Township 1 South Range 1 West Willamette Meridian, in Washington County, Oregon; running thence (Magnetic Variation $22^{\circ} 30'$ E.) South $1^{\circ} 26'$ West 498.0 feet to the center of County Road No. 568; thence in center of said road South $61^{\circ} 38'$ West 1381.9 feet to angle No. 1 in said road; thence North $83^{\circ} 00'$ West 1409.5 feet to the line between Sections 3 and 4, said township and range; thence North $0^{\circ} 30'$ West 967.0 feet along said Section line to an iron pipe on the South line of said Hall D.L. C.; thence North $89^{\circ} 57'$ East 2622.7 feet to the place of beginning, containing 56.7 acres, more or less. Less and except, however, from the above described tract that certain tract of 1.787 acres sold and conveyed by the grantors herein to D. E. Carlock and Mary Payne and recorded on page 632 of book 127 of Records of Deeds of Washington County, Oregon.

Tract Two: Commencing at the N.E. corner of a tract of land owned by John Huber in D. L.C. of Laurence Hall, on line between Sections 3 and 4, T. 1 S. R. 1 W. Will. Mer., thence S. 62 deg. W. 20 chs. to center of a small ditch; thence N. 32 deg. W. 6.66 chs. to the center of the main ditch; thence N. 65 deg. 30' E. 20.83 chs. to a point in main ditch where another small ditch intersects it; thence N. 46 deg. 30' E. 1 ch. to the N. line of the Lawrence Hall D. L. C.; thence S. 69 deg. E. 1.59 chs. to the N. E. corner of a 200-acre tract formerly owned by A. Selhiem to a stake on the Section line between Sections 3 and 4; thence S. 4.88 chs. to the place of beginning, containing 12.95 acres. Except 6.48 acres thereof sold to A. Brascesco August 11th, 1887, by deed recorded on page 258 of Book "Y" of the Record of Deeds of Washington County, Oregon, hereby conveying, however, a road along the main ditch across said 6.48 acre tract conveyed to said Brascesco 8 feet wide and the right of ingress and egress over said Brascesco tract, and full right to use all water for irrigating purpose from a spring running through said Brascesco tract.

PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.11 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Spring Creek and Johnson Spring

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation, Domestic and Stock, being 0.08 c.f.s from Spring Creek for irrigation and 0.03 c.f.s. from Johnson Spring for domestic and stock

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is September 12, 1944

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 11, 1945 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1946

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1947
