

\* APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Arthur E. Strain (Name of applicant) of Langlois (Post office), County of Curry, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Willow Creek (Name of stream), a tributary of Floras Creek

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.75 cubic feet per second. (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

4. The point of diversion is located 300 ft. south and 100 ft. east from the NW corner of Northeast 1/4 of the southeast 1/4 (Section or subdivision) (If preferable, give distance and bearing to section corner)

Diversion Works—

\*\* Applications for permits to appropriate water for the generation of electricity, with the exception of municipalities, must be made to the Hydro-electric Commission. PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same,  
SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use  
and shall not exceed 0.75 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the  
stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Willow Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per  
second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a  
diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the  
irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is April 30, 1945

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 15, 1946 and shall  
thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before  
October 1, 1947

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1948
