

* APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Adolph Habluetzel (Name of applicant) of 3335 N. E. 51st, Portland 13, Oregon (Mailing address) State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 1200 Gals. Per Hour (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each) cubic feet per second.

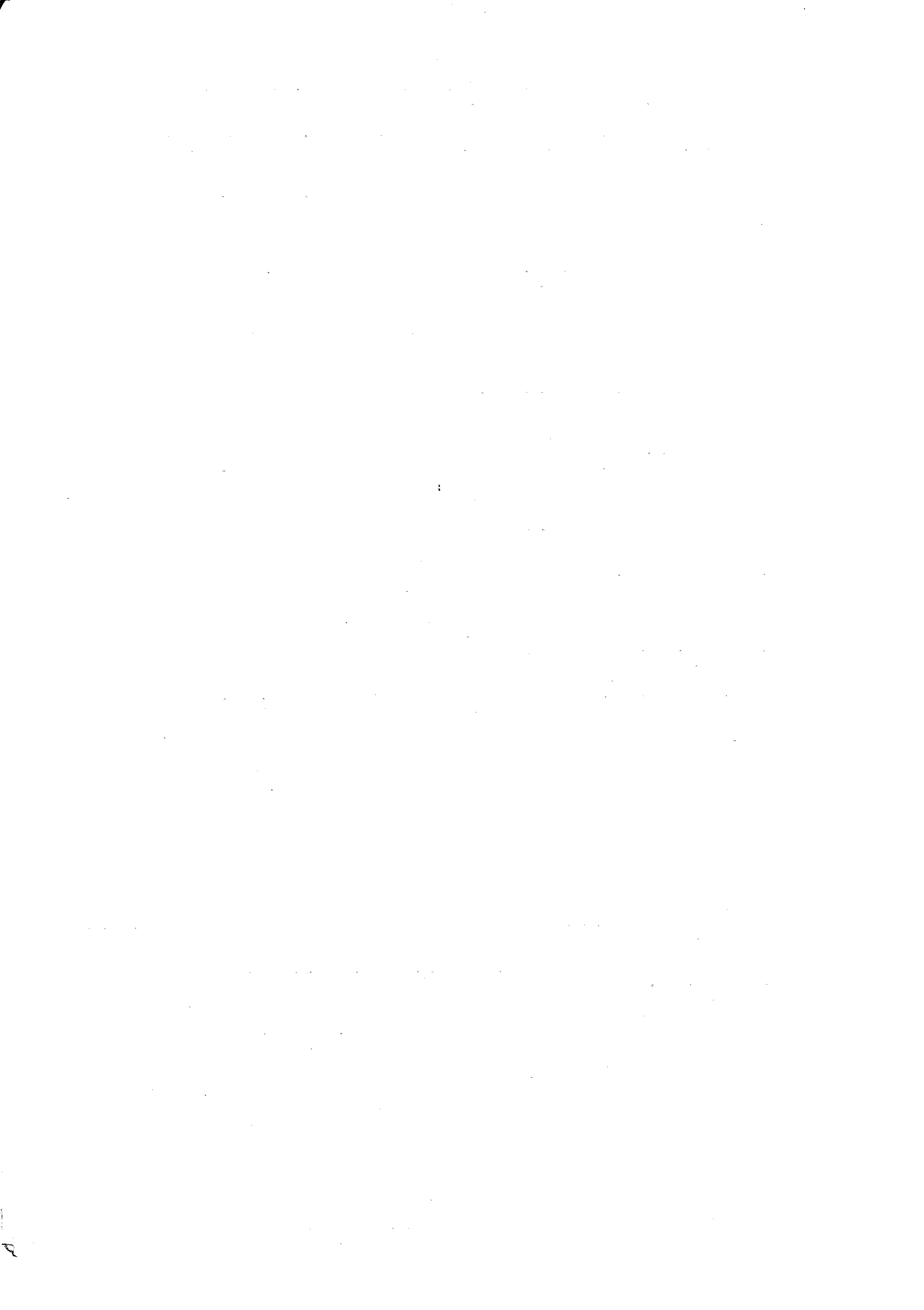

STATE OF OREGON, } ss County of Marion,

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.045 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Willamette River

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation and fire protection, being 0.025 c.f.s. for irrigation and 0.02 c.f.s. for fire protection.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is May 20, 1946

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 15, 1947 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before

October 1, 1948

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1949
