To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the

following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Ten Mile Creek and a unnamed branch.

a tributary of Ten Mile Creek, a tributary of Olalla Creek in lot 4, Sec. 23, U. S. Govt. land

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is portable pump. 6,463 gallons per day domestic use and family garden cubic feet per second. 6,240 gallons per hour for portable pump

\*\*3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation and domestic water from Ten Mile Cree for Irrigation of farm crops. water from unnamed branch for irrigation of family garden and domestic

4. The point of diversion is located 852 ft. W and 1287.66 ft. S from the SE corner of E.M. Gurney DIC. Sec. 15-14-22-23. This is for portable pump.

domestic, 330 ft. S and 428 ft. W bearing N 60 E from spring to garden and house from the exterior L. corner S. W from diversion of domestic supply to place of use is 964 ft. bearing N. 60 E. From diversion.

being within the portable pumping domestic of Sec. 23, Tp. 28 S, R. 8 W

5. The domestic pipeline to be 500 ft. 964 feet in length, terminating in the SE 1/4 of Sec. 23, Tp. 28 S, R. 8 W

Remarks: I am making this application for domestic water and irrigation water in one application.

I am enclosing personel check for \$25.10 to cover the costs of examination, Recording & domestic use. And ten cents for blueprint.

The spring is located in the bed of a creek so it is not considered a spring.

The diversion is located on U. S. Govt. property and the U. S. General Land office in Roseburg Oregon informed me that I must have my permit and catificate from the state, to make my application for right of way. It would seem that the laws are conflicting if I can't get the permit from the state until I have the right of way from the U. S. Govt. as the U. S. Govt. says I must first have the permit from the state. That leaves me in the middle. I hope the corrections are satisfactory.

The diversion for the domestic supply consists of a wooden Box 20 inches square sunk in the stream bed. the pipe enters the box.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.24 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Ten Mile Creek and unnamed stream

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation and domestic, including irrigation of 1/2 acre domestic garden, being 0.23 c.f.s. for irrigation from Ten Mile Creek and 0.01 c.f.s. for domestic from unnamed stream.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is September 7, 1948

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 17, 1950 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1950

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1951
