Beginning at an iron pipe in the W. line of the Thomas J. Chase D.L.C. 76.6 Links E. from the E. Corner of the Joseph Magoon D.L.C. in T. 5 S. R. 1 W. of the willamette Meridian in Marion County, Oregon; thence S. 9.67 chains to an iron bar; thence E. 2.96 chains to a harrowtooth; thence N. 60°-31' E. 3.14 chains to an iron bar; thence N. 10.63 chains to the center of the Butte Creek; thence down said creek in a N. westerly direction to the W. line of said Chase D. L. C.; thence S. 8.20 chains to the point of beginning; containing 7.00 acres of land in the Thomas Chase D. L. C. in T. 5 S. R. 1 W., Marion County, Oregon.

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the Donation Land Claim of Thos. J. Chase and wife, in Township 5 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Marion County, Oregon; thence North 54' West on the West boundary of aforesaid Land Claim, a distance of 34 chains and 67 links; thence West 75 links to East corner of Donation Land Claim of Jos. STATE OF OREGON,

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.78 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Butte Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is June 24, 1949 for 0.50 cfs and July 14, 1949 for 0.28 cfs Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 15, 1951 and shall

thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before

October 1, 1952

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1953
