To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, THE CALIFORNIA OREGON POWER COMPANY (Name of applicant) of 216 West Main Street, Medford (Mailing address), State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the

following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation Incorporated in the State of California, October 16, 1920

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is North Umpqua River (Name of stream), a tributary of Umpqua River

2. The amount of water which the applicant applies to beneficial use is 12.0 cubic feet per second. (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

**3. The use to which the water is to be applied is for the municipal water supply of the City of Roseburg, Oregon and for domestic and other public purposes in the vicinity thereof.

4. The point of diversion is located 4064.0 ft. N and 978.7 ft. E from the 1/4 corner of between Sections 25 and 36, T. 26 S., R. 6 W. W.M. (Section or subdivision)

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

Diversion Works—

(b) Description of headgate works - Low lift pumphouse - reinforced concrete substructure, 10'x12' inside dimensions, side walls (Timber, concrete, etc., number and size of openings) 25'3" high superstructure, frame house, 12'x14', 8'3" to roof joists, pumping directly from the River from below Winchester Dam.

(c) If water is to be pumped give general description 2 - 750 g.p.m. at 45' head Yeoman turbine pumps, 1 - 2500 g.p.m. at 45' head Byron - Jackson turbine pump and 1 - 1280 g.p.m. at 45' head Byron Jackson centrifugal pump operated by 2 - 15 HP, 1 - 40 HP and 1 - 20 HP motors respectively.

Remarks: ~~Prior to the year 1909, the predecessors in interest of Applicant went upon the bed and banks of the North Umpqua River at approximately the point herein before designated to appropriate and divert a sufficient amount of the flow of said stream to supply municipal, domestic and other public uses in and in the vicinity of Roseburg, Oregon. At all times since prior to the said year 1909, Applicant and its predecessors in interest have continuously diverted and used the water of said stream for such purposes under a claim of right so to divert and use the same by appropriation.~~

~~The amount of waters so appropriated has been placed to the beneficial use above mentioned as required to meet the demands of the City of Roseburg and of the public in and in its environs. This application is made for an appropriation in an amount sufficient to supply existing requirements of the City of Roseburg and vicinity.~~

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 12.0 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from North Umpqua River

The use to which this water is to be applied is For Municipal Supply of City of Roseburg, Oregon, and for domestic and other public purposes in the vicinity thereof.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is June 2, 1950

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 8, 1951 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1952

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1953
