APPLICATION FOR PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC
WATERS OF THE STATE OF OREGON

Sauvie Island Drainage District, a public corporation of Multnomah and Columbia counties, State of Oregon, whose mailing address is 1016 Spalding Building, Portland 4, Oregon, hereby makes application for permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights. The applicant is a public corporation organized under the provisions of Oregon laws 1915 Chapter 340 as amended and supplemented.

The date of the Court's decree declaring it duly incorporated was August 1, 1938. The place of its incorporation was Multnomah County.

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is the applicant's system of interior drainage (including Gilbert River), Big Sturgeon Lake, the Columbia River and the so-called Multnomah channel and main channel of the Willamette River.

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 100 cubic feet per second. It is not feasible to subdivide this figure among the sources of the proposed appropriation.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation for crop production.

4. It is not feasible to state the point of diversion. The points of diversion will all be within the district's territorial area of 12,013.44 acres and will be fixed by the temporary stations of portable pumps or pumping equipment.

5. Not applicable.

6. (a) There will be no dam.

(b) The applicant expects to pump water but it is not feasible at this time to describe the size and type of the pumps or pumping equipment to be used or of the engine or motor to be used or the total head the water is to be lifted.

7. There will be no new canal system or pipe line to be constructed.

8. It is not feasible to specify herein with particularity the location of the area to be irrigated or the place of use other than to say that all of the arable land within the applicant's territorial area probably will require from time to time in the future water for irrigation. A map is being prepared and will be forwarded as soon as it is

finished to be attached hereto. This map shows the territorial area lying within the applicant's boundaries as well as the location of the principal canals and ditches (whether natural or artificial) that constitute integral parts of the applicant's system of interior drainage.

The legal descriptions of the various tracts of land that go to make up its entire territorial area are voluminous and it is not feasible to set them out here. However, they are all contained in the annual assessment roll of Sauvie Island Drainage District on file in the offices of the Assessors of Multnomah County and of Columbia County, are public records and reference can be had to them at any time by any interested person.

(a) The soil may be characterized as Sauvie deep silt loam.

(b) Almost all kinds of locally adapted crops are raised on the lands within Sauvie Island Drainage District.

The areas to be irrigated are located in Columbia County in Township 3 North, Range 1 West, W.M. in Sections 19 and 20 and in Multnomah County in the same Township and Range in Sections 35, 34, 33, 32, 31, 30, 29 and 28, and in Township 2 North, Range 1 West, W.M. in the same County in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23, 27 and 28. The areas to be irrigated include all of Sections 15, 16, 10, 3 and 4 in Township 2 North, Range 1 West, and all of Section 32 in Township 3 North, Range 1 West. The areas to be irrigated also include less than the whole of Sections 8, 9, 5, 6, 7, 17, 16, 21, 28, 27, 22, 23, 14, 11 and 2 in Township 2 North, Range 1 West, and of Sections 35, 34, 33, 28, 29, 20, 19, 30 and 31 in Township 3 North, Range 1 West. It is not practicable to set down here each forty-acre tract of land by legal description that may or will be irrigated completely in time, - much less the number of acres that may or will be irrigated eventually in each fractional forty within the applicant's territorial limits. An attempt to do so would result in a more or less meaningless and unreliable approximation. The applicant will be ready and willing at any time in the future to furnish upon request more specific information in respect of the location of areas that actually are being irrigated and of the number of acres so irrigated.

10. Not applicable.

11. The proposed works will consist of portable pumps and perhaps in a few instances inexpensive and temporary housing therefor. The cost

thereof will depend upon the demands from time to time for irrigation that can be met reasonably. Such cost will be incurred only to an extent that will be reasonable and that will make possible the performance of the contemplated irrigation project and service on a sound and workable business basis. It is not feasible now to estimate such cost.

12. Construction work will begin on or before March 1, 1951.

13. It is not feasible now to specify on or before what date construction work will be completed. Such work will be done from time to time to keep it co-extensive with then existing demands for water for irrigation. When such demands increase, there will be new construction reasonably commensurate with the then current demands.

14. The water will be completely applied to the proposed use as the need and demand therefor develop from time to time. It is not possible to specify now on or about what date 100 cubic feet per second of water will be in beneficial use for irrigation of lands within the applicant's territorial boundaries.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 100.0 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from drainage, Gilbert River, Big Sturgeon Lake, Columbia River and Multnomah Channel and Main Channel of the Willamette River.

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation of not to exceed 11,559.61 acres.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall be still further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 100.0 c.f.s.,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is April 5, 1950

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 29, 1951 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1952

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1953 Extended to Oct. 1, 1958 Extended to Oct. 1, 1963 Extended to Oct. 1, 1968
