

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Henry Moore & Nellie M. Moore Husband and wife (Name of applicant)

of R.F.D. #1 Aurora, Oregon (Name of town)

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Mill Creek & UNNAMED SEEP, a tributary of Pudding River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is .385 cubic feet per second. of which .375 in for irrigation & .01 for domestic purposes

**3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation and domestic and stock

4. The point of diversion is located 2087.91 ft. West and 200 ft. South from the N.E. corner of Section 21 T.4 S.R. 1W. W.M. Marion County Oregon

being within the N.W. 1/4 of N.E. of Sec. 21, Tp. 4 S.R. 1W

R. W. M., in the county of Marion

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.385 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Mill Creek and unnamed seepage

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation, domestic and stock, being 0.375 c.f.s. for irrigation and 0.01 for domestic and stock

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is October 29, 1951

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 31, 1953 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1954

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1955
