

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, J. L. Lebeck of Rt 1 Box 38 Forest Grove Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Tualatin River, a tributary of Willamette River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.625 + 0.175 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation

4. The point of diversion is located 756.6 ft. S and 211.1 ft. W from the N 1/4 corner of Sec. 18

being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Sec. 18 Tp. 15

R. 3 W, W. M., in the county of Washington

5. The Pipe line to be 2000 ft. in length, terminating in the of Sec. 18 Tp. 15

West 18.18 chains to a post, thence North 23 deg. 54' West 23.89 chains to the center of the Tualation River, thence down the center of said river with the meanderings thereof to a point distant South 77 deg. West 3.80 chains from a post set for the Southeast corner of a tract of land conveyed by Wm. and Luther Parsons and wife to R. M. Painter by deed recorded in Book "F", pages 28 and 29, Deed Records of Washington County, Oregon, thence North 77 deg. East 3.80 chains to said post, thence South 34½ deg. This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.800 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Tualatin River

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is April 26, 1951 for 0.625 c.f.s. September 14, 1951 for 0.175 c.f.s.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 30, 1953 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1954

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1955
