



APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, S. L. McNeill, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Mary's River, a tributary of Willamette

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 23 cubic feet per second

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation

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Beginning at a point on the Section line 22.233 chains North $89^{\circ}57'$ east of the northwest corner of Section 8, Township 11 south, Range 7 west of the Willamette Meridian, being the northeast corner of lands conveyed to David D. Peterson by deed recorded Book 69, Page 600, Deed Records of Benton County, Oregon, thence along the south line of said Peterson land south $18^{\circ}39'$ west 5.322 chains, thence south $48^{\circ}35'$ west 2.387 chains, thence south $25^{\circ}18'$ west 1.873 chains, thence south $47^{\circ}30'$ west 1.246 chains, thence south $84^{\circ}58'$ west 8.817 chains, thence south 56° west 4.566 chains, thence south $76^{\circ}16'$ west 1.849 chains, thence north $71^{\circ}57'$ west 4.574 chains to a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pipe at the east side of the County Road, thence north $71^{\circ}57'$ west to the center of the wagon road from Corvallis to Yaquina Bay, thence southerly along the center of said wagon road to the most northerly northeast corner of lands deeded to Geo. Wigle and Fay Wigle, his wife, by deed recorded Book 74, Page 130, Deed Records of Benton County, Oregon, being a point 17.638 chains south and .317 chains east of the northwest corner of said Section 8, and running thence along the center of the County Road and along the easterly boundary of said Wigle land, south $27^{\circ}15'$ east 3.413 chains, south $17^{\circ}10'$ east 2.03 chains, south $32^{\circ}18'$ east 1.988 chains, south $47^{\circ}47'$ east 5.481 chains, south $60^{\circ}03'$ east 6.18 chains, south $46^{\circ}18'$ east 3.798 chains, south $58^{\circ}03'$ east 5.322 chains to a 1" iron rod, thence leaving said road south $0^{\circ}35'$ east 3.446 chains to the south line of the north half of said Section 8, thence easterly along said half section line to the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of said Section 8, thence northerly to a point 64 chains south of the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of said Section 8, thence west parallel to Section line 96 rods, thence north to Mary's River, thence along the meanders of said Mary's River to the north line of said Section 8, thence westerly along said north line of said Section to place of beginning;

EXCEPTING beginning at a point on the east line of County Road No. 521, which point is 425.74 feet S. $88^{\circ}59'$ W., along the north line of Section 7, Township 11 south, Range 7 west, Willamette Meridian, in Benton County, Oregon, and 1302.18 feet south $22^{\circ}42\frac{1}{2}'$ east along said east line of said road, from the northeast corner of said Section 7, and running thence north $47^{\circ}17\frac{1}{2}'$ E., at right angles to said Road, 100 feet, thence north 320.35 feet to a $3/4$ inch pipe at the east southerly corner of the tract of land described in deed recorded in Book 115, Page 512, Benton County Deed Records and in the center of County Road No. 330, thence north $71^{\circ}36'$ west along the south line of said tract and the center of the last mentioned road, 296.93 feet to the east line of said road No. 521, thence south $22^{\circ}42\frac{1}{2}'$ E. 490.71 feet to the point of beginning, containing 1.60 acres.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.23 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Mary's River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall be still further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 0.23 c.f.s.,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is March 21, 1952

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 30, 1953 and shall

after be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1954

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1955
