

## \*APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

## To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Clem Taverner  
 of Myrtle Creek, Gazette Pt.  
 State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is South Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.25 cubic feet per second.

\*\*3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation

4. The point of diversion is located No 1 46 ft. S and 15' E from the NW corner of D.L.C. #44, T30S R3W W.M. (NW 1/4 Sec 20).  
 Diversion pt. No. 2 is located 295.5' South and 2726.3 East from the NW cor. of D.L.C. #44, T30S, R3W W.M. (SENE Sec 20). If preferable, give distance and bearing to section corner.

(If there is more than one point of diversion, each must be described. Use separate sheet if necessary.)  
 being within the R. 5 W. W.M. in the county of Douglas.

5. The Pipe Line to be 300' in length, terminating in the S E N E of Sec. 20 Tr. 52, R. 5 W. W.M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the map, survey or sketch.

"Beginning at a point 15 chains and 34 links North and 1 chain and 50 links East of the Northeast corner of the Southeast quarter of Section 20 in Township 30 South, Range 5 West of the Willamette Meridian, and running thence South 87 chains and 64 links, thence West 22 chains and 28 links; thence North 74 chains and 1 link; thence East 8 chains and 40 links; thence North 14 chains and 19 links and thence East 13 chains and 69 links to the place of beginning, containing One Hundred Eighty three and Ninety eight Hundredths (183.98) acres; Also Beginning at a point 22.34 chains North and 20.75 chains West of the quarter section post on line between Sections 20 and 21 in Township 30 South, Range 5 West; thence West 15.10 chains, thence South 40 chains, thence West 15 chains; thence South 55 chains; thence East 30.10 chains; thence North 95 chains to the place of beginning; containing two Hundred and Twenty five (225) or a sum containing in the above one Four Hundred Eighty and Ninety eight hundredths (488.98) acres, more or less, and situated in Douglas County, Oregon.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same,  
**SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS** and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use  
and shall not exceed 0.249 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the  
stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from South Umpqua River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per  
second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a  
diversion of not to exceed  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the  
irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is March 19, 1952

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 29, 1953 and shall  
thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before  
October 1, 1954

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before  
October 1, 1955
