

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Philip H. Wills, (Name of applicant)

of Route #1, Box #523, Tigard, Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation.

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Tualatin River a tributary of Willamette River; and from an unnamed spring which is a tributary of Tualatin River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.250 cubic feet per second from Tualatin River and 0.01 c.f.s. from spring for fish culture 1 c.f.s.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation, household use and...

4. The point of diversion is located N42°E 2190 feet from the southwest corner of Section 10, T2S, R1W, W.M.

Pt. of Diversion for spring: N36°30'E 2540 ft. from the Southwest corner of Section 10, T2S, R1W, W.M.

being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Sec 10, T2S, R1W, W.M. in the county of Washington

Remarks: Property Description: Commencing at a point 40 rods south of the quarter section post between sections 15 and 16, T2S, R1W, W.M.; thence running north along said section line 63 rods; thence east 20 rods; thence south 48 rods; thence east to the center line of the county road leading over Taylor Bridge; thence south 15 rods; thence west to the place of beginning, and being in section 15, T2S, R1W, W.M.

Beginning at a point in the center of the Tualatin River on the line between sections 15 and 16, T2S, R1W, W.M., said point being 12.70 chains north of the corner of sections 15, 16, 21 and 22, and running thence north on section line 17.21 chains to a post and stone, said post and stone being 40 rods south of the quarter section corner between sections 15 and 16; thence east 38.60 chains to the center of the Tualatin River; thence S68°E along center of said river 11.00 chains to the center of the Tualatin River; thence S73°W 24.12 chains along center of river; thence S45°W along center of river 7.78 chsins to the place of beginning, all in section 15, T2S, R1W, W.M.

E. Murphy created by that certain deed recorded in book 107, page 583 in the records of deeds in the office of the county recorder of Washington County, Oregon, said right of way being described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of a 30-acre tract of land, situated in Washington County, Oregon, and heretofore and on or before the 24th day of October 1910, conveyed by us, said Myrtle Walton and H. E. Murphy, her husband, to said Belle Murphy and H. E. Murphy, which said deed was recorded in deed records of Washington County, Oregon, about the 24th day of October, 1910, and to which said deed and record thereon reference is hereby made for the purpose of this description; thence east 37 rods and 13 feet to a point; thence south 16 1/2 feet to a point; thence west parallel with said line 63 rods to a point; thence north 16 1/2 feet to the place of beginning.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.51 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from an unnamed spring and Tualatin River, being 0.26 cfs from spring and 0.25 cfs from Tualatin River.

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation, domestic and fish culture, being 0.25 cfs from Tualatin River for irrigation; 0.01 cfs from unnamed spring for domestic and 0.25 cfs from unnamed spring for fish culture.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is August 6, 1952

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 31, 1954 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1955.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1956
