Beginning on west line of the Huntley Claim # 56, T27S, R6W., N. M. at an Iron Pipe from which the northwest corner of said claim bears N.0°10'W. 1607.2 feet;

Thence along said claim line N.0°16'W., 720 feet to a post;

Thence N.56°19'E., 13.7 feet to a post;

Thence N.0°38'E., 43.1 feet to a post;

Thence S.89°38'E., 249.7 feet to the N.W. corner of a tract of land conveyed to Laurel Lodge # 13 by deed recorded 12-4-1890, in book 24, Page 5, Deed Records;

Thence easterly along the north line of said tract 375.54 feet to the west line of a tract conveyed to Douglas County for road purposes by deed from Laurel Lodge # 13, recorded November 25, 1948, in book 173, page 613, Deed Records;

Thence southerly on the west line of said County tract to the north line of a tract conveyed to United States of America by deed recorded April 4, 1932, in Book 94, Page 157, deed records;

Thence west on said north line 614.5 feet to a point 16 feet east of the west line of said claim # 56;

Thence North 210 feet to the south line of first addition to Masonic Cemetery, as shown in book 5, page 48, plat records;

Thence west on said south line, 16 feet to the west line of said claim;

Thence north on said west boundary 266.4 feet to the point of beginning.

M., Douglas County, Oregon, and being a portion of that property conveyed by that deed to Laurel Lodge # 13 AF & AM, recorded in book 3, page 100, of Douglas County records of deeds, excepting therefrom that part of that property conveyed to The United States of America by that deed recorded in Vol. 94, page 157, Douglas County records of deeds lying in said Jeremiah Huntley D. L. C. # 56. The said parcel being that portion of said property lying north of said government tract and included in a strip of land 250 feet in width, 125 feet on each side of the center line of the Pacific Highway as said highway has been relocated, which center line is described as follows:

Beginning at engineer's center line station 2510 + 31.75, said station being 283.8 feet south and 503.2 feet west of the northwest corner of said Jeremiah Huntley D.L.C. # 56;

Thence S.20°06'E., 1968.25 feet to engineer's center line station 2530 + 00. The easterly line of said strip of land intersects the west line of said Lodge property and the north line of said government tract approximately opposite engineer's station 2521 + 71 and 2526 + 80, respectively.

I, Chas. E. Stricklin, State Engineer, do hereby certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, **SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS** and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.22 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from South Umpqua River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is February 16, 1954

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 28, 1955 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1954

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1957
