, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

Beginning at a point in the south right of way line of Pacific Highway U. S. 99 and from which the Northeast corner of the Robert Hippo Donation Land Claim No. 37, Township 29 South, Range 6 West, T. 11., bears North 69° 25' West 260.0 feet and North 0° 25' West 835.3 feet, said point being the Northwest corner of that tract of land conveyed to Kenneth and Lula Hughes and described in Volume 144, page 507, of the Deed Records of Douglas County, Oregon, thence South 69° 25' East 10.0 feet and South 69° 51' East 107.0 feet along the said right of way line, thence South 45.1 feet to a point in the south boundary of said Hughes land, thence North 85° 21' West 120.4 feet along the south boundary of said Hughes land to the Southwest corner thereof, thence North 473.8 feet along the west boundary of said Hughes land to the place of beginning, containing 1.500 acres, more or less, in the Northeast quarter, Section 3, Township 29 South, Range 6 West, Willamette Meridian, Douglas County, Oregon.

Beginning at a 1/2 inch iron pipe on the south right of way line of the present location of the Pacific Highway, 30 feet out at right angles from its center line, said beginning point being South 0° 25' East 835.3 feet from the Northeast corner of the Robert Hippo Donation Land Claim No. 37; said Donation Land Claim being on the Township line on the 1/4 section line of Section 3, all in Township 29 South, Range 6 West, Willamette Meridian; thence following along said right of way line South 0° 25' East 260.0 feet to a 1/2 inch iron pipe, thence South 473.0 feet to a 1/2 inch iron pipe, then South 0° 25' East 22.3 feet to a 1/2 inch iron rod and 4 x 4 wooden post, which is the Northwest corner of the tract held by the State Highway Department described in Douglas County Clerk's records in Volume 101, page 2, then South 0° 25' East 81.7 feet along the west line of said Highway property to the Southwest corner of said property, then South approximately 110 feet to the West side line of Section 3, said line was in all cases, then South approximately 203.8 feet to the center of said Section 3, then South approximately 120 feet to a 1/2 inch iron pipe, then South 0° 25' East 12.0 feet to a 1/2 inch iron pipe; thence North 0° 25' West 17.0 feet to the Northwest corner of the Robert Hippo Donation Land Claim, then North 0° 25' West 12.0 feet to the place of beginning, containing 11.4 acres, more or less, all in the Northeast quarter, Section 3, Township 29 South, Range 6 West, Willamette Meridian, Douglas County, Oregon.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions.

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed ~~0.013~~ ^{0.013} cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from South Umpqua River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall be ^{still} further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 0.013 c.f.s.,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is May 13, 1955

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 22, 1956 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1957

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1958
