APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, A Creason (Name of Applicant)

of Mitchell, County of Wheeler (Postoffice)

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation.

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Mill Creek, a tributary of Bridge Creek and John Day River and Bridge Creek and Wood Camp Creek, tributary of John Day River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.86 from Mill Creek and 0.23 from Bridge Creek cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 5950 ft. from SW corner of Section 18 T. 12 S. R. 22 E W M from Mill Creek measured by angles of ditch survey. Point of diversion from Bridge Creek being within the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 17, and from Wood Camp Creek being with the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec 20. 12 S 22 E being within the SE 1/4 mill of Sec. 24, Tp. 12 S. (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 21 E, W. M., in the county of Wheeler (No. E. or W.)

5. The East Ditch to be 2.15 miles in length, terminating in the NE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 18, Tp. 12 S, R. 22 E (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.) (No. E. or W.)

W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is Creason East Ditch

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

DIVERSION WORKS—

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 1.1 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is July 28, 1915

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 11, 1916 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1917

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1918
