APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS OF THE STATE OF OREGON

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: The appropriation for irrigation purposes shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cu. ft. per sec. for each acre irrigated.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed two (2.00) cubic feet per second.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 18, 1911 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before

April 18, 1912

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

April 18, 1913
