This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.38 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Ransey Canyon and Small Reservoirs Numbers 1 and 2, to be constructed under application No. R-33350, Permit No. R- 2274

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1/4 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage from reservoirs to be constructed under permit No. R- 2274 ; provided further that the right to the use of direct flow is limited to the period when the flow of the river is less than more than 1000 c.f.s. immediately above Savage Rapids Dam and more than 1000 c.f.s. at its mouth,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer

The priority date of this permit is September 5, 1919

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 1, 1919 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1920

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1920
