APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Florence G McCabe

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Yew Creek (Name of stream) tributary of Jump-off-Joe Creek

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.5 cubic feet per second.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.18 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is September 24, 1915

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 6, 1916 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1917

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1918
