Remarks: *PALANDEE CREEK is a small intermittent stream running principally during spring runoff and is usually dry before June. Upon entering Big Valley it tends to spread over the land thru several channels. The main channel has been used as a control ditch to spread the waters more evenly upon the applied for lands. There is no direct channel carrying these waters directly into Deep Creek and only reaches Deep Creek channel during periods of high runoff after spreading over adjoining lands. It being approximately 3/4 mile to the channel of Deep Creek.*

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.96 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Polander Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/400 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is October 24, 1961

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 9, 1963 and shall

thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1963.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1964.
