APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is This land requires the same amount of water as other lands irrigated from North cubic feet per second. Powder River, namely one inch per acre to July 1 and 1/2 inch thereafter.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.

The use of the water under this permit shall be limited to water for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 2.0 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is July 26, 1916

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 7, 1917 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1918

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1919
