Remarks: No. 1. The location of the main point of diversion at the reservoir dam is S 52 deg. 55' W., 530 ft. distant from the 1/4 sec. cor. between Secs. 27 and 28 T 28 S R 44 E.W.M. Point of Diversion No. 2 bears N. 5 deg. 50' W 1087 ft. from the cor. of Secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22, T 29 S R 44 E.W.M. Point of Diversion No. 3 bears S 61 deg. 45' W 3504 ft. from the cor. of Secs. 3 and 4 on the north boundary of T 30 S R 44 E.W.M.

REMARK NO. 2. Cow Creek is used as the channel for carrying the main supply of water which water is diverted at diversion points No. 2 and 3, into laterals and canals on the land to be irrigated, as described on the accompanying map.

REMARK NO. 3. The Oliver Ditch, it is proposed shall be used for transporting the water from Upper Cow Creek Lake Reservoir, provided it is shown by experiment that it is not feasible to carry same through the main creek channel. It is to be enlarged and extended and will terminate on NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 22 T 29 S R 44 E. where it will empty into the regular irrigation system.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer.

The use of the water under this permit shall be limited to the water stored in the Upper Cow Creek Reservoir to be constructed under Application No. 5298, Permit No. R-391, for irrigation and a supplemental supply for the irrigation of lands already having a partial water right.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 23.75 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is December 14, 1916

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 10, 1918

and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before
