\*APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, James H. Day (Name of applicant)  
of Rt. 1, Box 1342 (Mailing address), Roseburg (City),  
State of Oregon, 97470 (Zip Code), do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the

following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

Remarks: Until recently the subject spring has layed well within a large ranch. The ranch has now been subdivided into parcels of from 5 to 20 acres.

The property involved is totally undeveloped and although there are some open meadow areas there will also be a substantial amount of clearing to be done.

We plan to study the springs minimum flow late this summer to be sure there is a sufficient quantity to justify the cost of clearing.

I assume land developed for pasture use need not be fully cleared. We plan to leave scattered oaks through-out the pasture area.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from an unnamed spring

The use to which this water is to be applied is domestic use for 3 families and irrigation being 0.01 cfs for domestic use and 0.05 cfs for irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is June 9, 1972

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 27, 1974 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1975.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1976.
