APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Edyth C Didian (Name of Applicant) of Freewater (Postoffice), County of Umatilla State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is East Branch of Crockett Branch (Name of stream) of Little Walla Walla, tributary of Columbia

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.10 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Winter Irrigation or surplus supply (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.) when plenty of water

4. The point of diversion is located Due West 400 ft. from 1/4 sec. corner between (Give distance and bearing to section corner) Sec. 25 & 26, Tp. 6 N R 35 E.W. M.

being within the SE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of Sec. 26, Tp. 6 N (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

STATE OF OREGON, County of Marion, ss.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer. The right to the use of water herein granted is limited to irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.1 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is January 2, 1919

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 17, 1920 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1921

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1922
