This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 6.07 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Rock Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is supplemental irrigation. The use allowed herein may be made anytime between October 1 and March 31 that water can be put to beneficial use by irrigation, either for immediate crop growth or for forecast requirements to raise the soil moisture to field capacity in the soil profile to be utilized by plant growth in the subsequent growing season.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the period from October 1 to March 31, provided further that the right allowed herein, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same land shall not exceed 4 acre feet for each acre irrigated in any one year. The use of water authorized herein shall not establish priority of right as against future appropriations of surface water for beneficial uses or for storage for such beneficial uses, other than similar rights for irrigation from October 1 to March 31. Sufficient flow shall be left in Rock Creek to provide stockwater throughout its course during the period of use authorized herein. and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is November 24, 1975

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 16, 1977 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1978

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1979
