\*APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Joseph and Nora Mesh (Name of applicant)

of Box 255 (Mailing address), Chiloquin (City)

State of Oregon, 97624 (Zip Code), do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the

following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Williamson River (Name of stream), a tributary of Upper Klamath Lake (City)

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.02 cubic feet per second (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 240 ft. S (N. or S.) and 800 ft. E W (E. or W.) from the NE corner of section 34 T34S R7E (Section or subdivision)

(If preferable, give distance and bearing to section corner)

(If there is more than one point of diversion, each must be described. Use separate sheet if necessary) being within the NE NE (Give smallest legal subdivision) of Sec. 34, Tp. 34S (N. or S.), R. 7E (E. or W.), W. M., in the county of Klamath

5. The pipe line (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) to be 360' (Miles or feet) in length, terminating in the NE NE (Smallest legal subdivision) of Sec. 34, Tp. 34S (N. or S.), R. 7E (E. or W.), W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

Diversion Works—

6. (a) Height of dam feet, length on top feet, length at bottom feet; material to be used and character of construction (Loose rock, concrete, masonry, rock and brush, timber crib, etc., wasteway over or around dam)

(b) Description of headgate (Timber, concrete, etc., number and size of openings)

(c) If water is to be pumped give general description (Size and type of pump)

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Williamson River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is August 16, 1976

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 12, 1978 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1978.

Extended to Oct. 1979

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1979.
