WATER RESOURCES DEPT. APPLICATION FOR PERMIT SALEM, OREGON

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Verl E. Fleischman (Name of applicant) of Route 1, Box 12 (Mailing address), Maupin (City), State of Oregon, 97037 (Zip Code), do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 3.35 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from waste water

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation and supplemental irrigation.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year; provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein, and shall also be limited to the water available at the proposed point of diversion, and shall not carry with it the right to compel the continuance of the waste water.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is August 23, 1976

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 12, 1978 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1978...

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1979...
