To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Nick Tennant (Name of applicant) of Star Route West, Mt. Vernon (Mailing address) (City) State of Oregon, 97865 (Zip Code)

do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is John Day River (Name of stream), a tributary of Columbia River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is .378 cubic feet per second (If water is to be used from more than one source, give quantity from each)

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 1150 ft. N and 2100 ft. E from the SW corner of Section 14, T. 13S., R. 28E., W.M. (Section or subdivision)

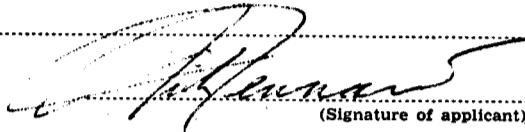

Remarks: The water is to be appropriated from the John Day River through the existing McCulloch Ditch, the point of diversion being 1150 feet north and 2100 feet east from the south west corner of section 14, Township 13 south, Range 28 east, W.M., and is then to be pumped from the ditch at a point located 1980 feet north and 2244 feet east from the south east corner of section 15, township 13 south, Range 28 east, W.M.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.38 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from John Day River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is November 1, 1976

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 18, 1978 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1978.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1979.
