Pump to be installed on platform on south side of City of Albany Water Intake building. Will be removed in winter months. Pump will be two stage, centrifugal, with single phase 1 1/2 HP motor. Heads will be rotary pop-up turf heads with underground distribution system and electrical clock controller.


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Remarks: This particular acreage at one time was property of the U.S. Government and was known at the Adair Intake Station Park. The County has had this park for about four years and has not been irrigated for several years. The City of Albany owns the Intake Building and pump water from the Willamette at this location. I do not know of any water rights or permits now in affect that the government might have had. We therefore are applying for this permit for the County independent of the City of Albany.

Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Willamette River.....

The use to which this water is to be applied is..... irrigation.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2½ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,


and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is February 2, 1978.....

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 10, 1979 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1979

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1980
