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### Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 3.31 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from North Yamhill River.

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation and water fowl attraction; being 3.31 c.f.s. for irrigation and 1.0 c.f.s. for water fowl attraction.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right allowed herein allowing for water fowl attraction shall be subordinate and inferior to all future rights for beneficial consumptive use.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is July 22, 1977

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 25, 1979 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1980

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1981
