The spring flows into a sub-surface brick cistern in which a submersible pump puts water to a domicile approximately 1600 feet directly west of the spring. The pump house next to the cistern used to house a piston type pump, but now serves only as an electrical relay center to the submersible pump which is placed directly into the cistern. The exact size and location of the pipeline are not known. The location of pipeline shown on the maps is based on logic only.

Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from a spring.

The use to which this water is to be applied is domestic use for two families.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is April 23, 1979

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 13, 1980 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1981

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1982
