make application for a permit to appropriate the following described waters of the State of Oregon:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is John Day River, a tributary of Columbia River

2. The point of diversion is to be located 2400 ft. South and 3800 ft. East from the section corner common to Sections 25, 26, 35 and 36 (Public Land Survey Corner)

(If there is more than one point of diversion, each must be described)

being within the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec. 36 Tp. 8S R. 19E, W. M., in the county of Wheeler

3. Location of area to be irrigated, or place of use if other than irrigation.



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Remarks: This property was acquired under a court judgment in 1972 as part of the lands adjacent to the Oregon Scenic Rivers System. It is now owned by the State Department of Transportation and is administered by the Scenic Rivers Section of the Parks and Recreation Division. To utilize this land, the owners have decided to lease a part of this land with restrictions as to use - perennial crops. This water right application is to provide for the water necessary to produce this crop. No lease has been signed as of this date and no irrigation system set up. The most logical irrigation will be a pump placed at the point of diversion and a movable irrigation piping system used.

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Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.36 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from John Day River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is January 25, 1980

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 9, 1981 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1982

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1983
