APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right to the use of water herein granted is limited to irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 1.0 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is March 5, 1920.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 27, 1921, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1922.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1923.
