make application for a permit to appropriate the following described waters of the State of Oregon:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Selmon River, a tributary of Pacific Ocean

2. The point of diversion is to be located 1070' ft. N. and 650' ft. W. from the S.E. corner of Section 26 (Public Land Survey Corner)

(If there is more than one point of diversion, each must be described)

being within the S.E. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 26 Tp. 6 S. R. 10 W., W. M., in the county of Lincoln

3. Location of area to be irrigated, or place of use if other than irrigation.

Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Salmon River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation of lawn and non-commercial garden not to exceed one-half acre in area

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is February 22, 1980

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 25, 1981 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1982

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1983 Extended to Oct. 1, 1984
