make application for a permit to appropriate the following described waters of the State of Oregon:

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Umpqua River, a tributary of Pacific Ocean

2. The point of diversion is to be located 4020 ft. and 1390 ft. from the N.E. corner of Section 30

(If there is more than one point of diversion, each must be described)

being within the S. 21/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 30 Tp. 23 S. R. 7, W.M., in the county of Douglas

3. Location of area to be irrigated, or place of use if other than irrigation.

4. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.43 C.F.S.

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

Include dimensions and type of construction of diversion dam and headgate, length and dimensions of supply ditch or pipeline, size and type of pump and motor, type of irrigation system to adequately describe the proposed distribution system.

It will be pumping water directly from the main Umpqua River. At present we will be using our five horse motor and a four inch mainline.

It will be using a sprinkler type system.

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Remarks: As soon as the engineering on a new system is completed and three phase power furnished, we will be using a larger motor and system.

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Permit to appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.43 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Umpqua River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is July 7, 1980

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 14, 1981 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1982

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1983
