1. The source of the proposed appropriation is

complete with foot valve and strainer will be placed

in slack water pond that is free from aquatic life.

It will be used to pump irrigation water to approximately

The pump discharge will be 242 GPM 80th PSI. The pipe is 2½"

PVC buried on an exsisting system that will be completely

disconnected from the city water system.

The pump is anticipated to operate approximately 10 hours

per week.

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Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.25 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Columbia River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is June 17, 1980

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 26, 1981 and shall

thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1982

Extended to Oct. 1, 1983

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1983
