Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.70 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from John Day River

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation and supplemental irrigation, being 0.6 cfs for irrigation and 0.1 cfs for supplemental irrigation.

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is April 10, 1981

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 15, 1982 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1983

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1984
