

Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 4.0 acre feet stored water only measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Applegate Lake Reservoir constructed under Permit R-7810

The use to which this water is to be applied is..... supplemental irrigation


