### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined Application 60105 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gilbert L. Schafer of Fossil, Oregon 97830, for the use of the waters of John Day River, for the purpose of irrigation; that the priority of the right dates from April 28, 1981 and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.5 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be located: 800 feet south and 780 feet west from the center of Section 20, being within the NE 1/4SW 1/4 of Section 20, Township 7 South, Range 19 East, WM, in the county of Wheeler.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed five acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 7 South    Range 19 East, WM    Section 20    NE 1/4SW 1/4    20.0 acres

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 8, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1983.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1984.
