PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 60929 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Leo DuMilleu of Route 6, Box 3520, Lakeview, Oregon 97630, phone 947-3433, for the use of the waters of a natural pond, a tributary of Goose Lake, for the PURPOSE of irrigations that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 22, 1980, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.50 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 960 feet South and 2,080 feet East from the NW I/4 Corner of Section 6, being within the NE I/4 NW I/4 of Section 6, Township 41 South, Range 19 East, WM, in the County of Lake.

A description of the place of use under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 41 South Range 19 East, WM Section 6 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 10-16 acres SE 1/4 NW 1/4 10-0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed two and one-half acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 23, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1983.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1984.
